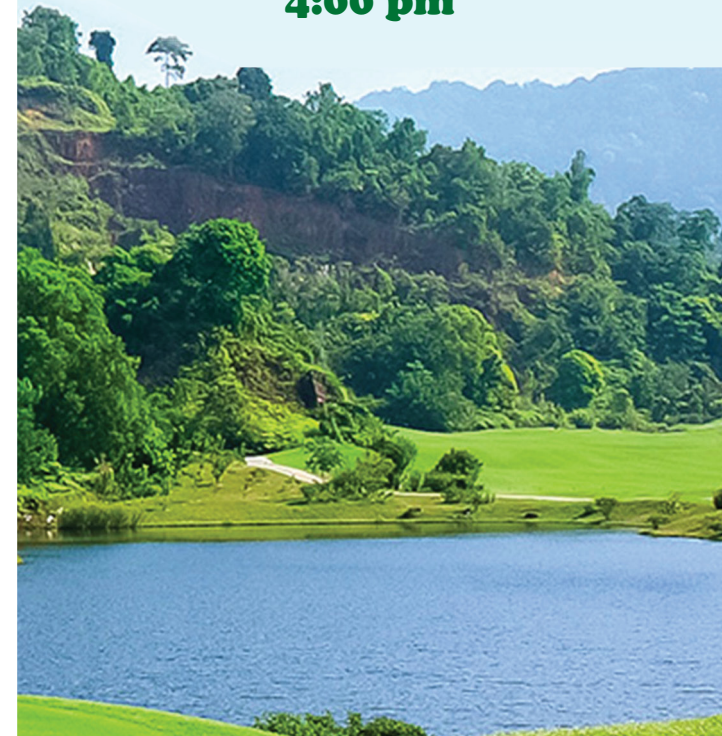

How It Works

The Community 2000 Virtual Masters Scholarship event will take place at 4 pm on Saturday, April 2nd, 2017, at The Weekapaug Golf Club, 265 Shore Road, Westerly, RI.

At the event, the organization will provide hors d'oeuvres, as well as beer and/or wine for up to one hundred registrants in an auction of the Masters golfers at Augusta National (April 6-9, 2017) - some 70-75 players via silent auction and the top 20-25 players via live auction.

A registration fee of fifty dollars provides fun, food, and beer or wine on April 2nd, 2017, and a chance to bid on the 2017 Augusta National Masters Tourney (April 6-9) players. **If you bid on and win a player who goes on to win the Masters on April 9th, you or your bidding group will win the Virtual Masters first place prize. Four additional Individual and 5-10 Player Group Prizes will also be available.**

All net proceeds will go to support the Community 2000 Scholarship efforts.

Individual Prizes

First Place

Scholarship Endowment History

The Community 2000 Scholarship Endowment consists of eleven segments – each providing need-based scholarship support to Chariho college students (see table below).

In the spring of 2015, the Community 2000 Board made a long-term commitment to grow the Scholarship Endowment from a little over \$600,000 to \$1.4 million dollars, while continuing modest growth of the other three Community 2000 Endowments and our partnership endowments with the Westerly College Club and the Rotary Club of Chariho.

In making this commitment, the Board accepted a challenge to raise approximately \$800,000. If we manage to add an average of \$50,000 a year in net income to the Scholarship Endowment for the next seven years - and the stock market provides moderate appreciation - we should be close to reaching our \$1.4 million scholarship goal. This will allow the Scholarship Endowment, with its eleven different segments, to support 30-35 students per year with \$2,000 annual scholarships, enabling the normal annual contributions to increase the number and/or dollar value of Community 2000 scholarships.
